Employing 75 people with the help of NyECC-Career Connections

Denny's will be opening soon in Pahrump and will employ 75 people with the help of NyECC-Career Connections. Unfortunately most people, including many business owners and managers don't know that the NyECC-Career Connections office can help them find the right worker at the right time. It's true, one of the goals for the adult workforce development team is to work closely with private-sector business, business groups and industry organizations to understand and address their current and future workforce needs.

Sometimes workers have unusual barriers to employment and need a little extra help. In certain cases, NyECC-Career Connections offers special employment services to people in targeted groups that have unique needs or are known to have greater difficulty finding a job.

Once Denny's made the decision to open a restaurant in Pahrump one of the first things on the check list was to contact NyECC-Career Connections. *Farrokh Vosough, Area Director for Denny's, worked with Diane Lake, the Manager at Career Connections.*

A few of the services that helped Denny's was the use of office space for interviews and new hire orientation. Diane's team also supported new hires with assistance getting health cards, and work attire including bringing out the Shoes 4 Crews truck so clients wouldn't have to travel to Las Vegas to get proper footwear. NyECC-Career Connections also provided transportation assistance to some of the new hires for training in Las Vegas. Vosough said that working with Diane and her team was "wonderful, very helpful". Back to School Health Fair Report

The numbers are in and more than 750 Nye County residents attended the 4th Annual NyE Communities Coalition Back to School Health Fair on August 6th at Desert View Hospital. Most of the health services were delivered at no cost to children with the exception of a small fee for sports physicals.

- * More than 25 exhibitors shared information and services
- * More than 100 children received almost 300 immunizations
- * 150 children had a dental screening
- * 115 children had their vision checked
- * 50 children had sports physicals
- * 500 hot dogs and bags of chips were given away
- * 1,500 bottles of ice-cold water were given away

Youth Werks is a program for youth 16 through 21 years of age. Services provided through the program include: educational services such as help with credit recovery, tutoring, costs for GED testing, ESL skills, classes to help with proficiency exams; work readiness training such as paid and unpaid work experiences, internships and apprenticeships.

Other services may include workshops and training on leadership skills, life skills, financial literacy, healthy decision making, conflict management, social skills and personal development, resume' writing and interview skills, etc.

Supportive services that supplement the work readiness training may include gas vouchers for travel to and from worksites and job interviews, work related gear and clothing, specialized training costs and incentives for achieving identified goals and objectives.

To qualify for the program, youth must be identified as low income and have an employment challenge. To find out if you qualify for this program contact our office. To register for the program, youth must provide the following documentation: birth certificate, social security card, school or state issued ID or driver's license with picture and proof of household income. If male and over the age of eighteen, the youth must be registered for the selective service.

Cheesy Chicken Pasta

This ooey-goey pasta dish is a crowd-pleaser for adults and kids alike—think rich and creamy macaroni-and-cheese tossed with cauliflower and chicken. Serve with a spinach salad.

Servings: 6

Yield: 6 servings, about 1 1/3 cups each

Total Time: 35 minutes / **Prep Time:** 35 minutes



Recipe Steps:



1. Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add pasta and cook for 5 minutes. Add cauliflower florets and cook until the pasta and florets are tender, about 4 minutes more. Drain, rinse and return to the pot.
2. Meanwhile, heat oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add onion and cook, stirring, until tender, 2 to 3 minutes. Add wine and cook until reduced slightly, about 1 minute. Whisk milk, flour, salt and pepper together in a medium bowl and add to the pan. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat, stirring frequently. Cook, stirring, until thickened, about 1 minute. Reduce heat to low and stir in cheese until smooth. Stir chicken (or turkey) and mustard into the cheese sauce; cook until heated through, about 2 minutes.
3. Stir the sauce into the drained pasta and cauliflower. Serve sprinkled with chives (or scallion greens).

Recipe Ingredients

1. 8 ounces whole-wheat penne
2. 2 cups 1/2-inch cauliflower florets
3. 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
4. 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
5. 1/2 cup dry white wine
6. 3 cups low-fat milk
7. 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
8. 3/4 teaspoon salt
9. 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
10. 1 cup shredded Gruyère or Swiss cheese
11. 3 cups shredded cooked chicken or turkey (12 ounces; see Tip)
12. 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
13. 2 tablespoons chopped fresh chives or scallion greens

What kids need to succeed - asset #3 Other Adult Relationships

- Give your children opportunities to spend time with other adults-trusted neighbors, favorite teachers. Or relatives they feel comfortable with and like being around.
- Encourage your children to join adult-sponsored groups, troops, or teams.
- If your children have special interests, hobbies, or passions, arrange for them to meet adult friends of yours who share their interests.
- Take family vacations with other families.
- When you invite friends over for social occasions, include your children and theirs in your plans and conversations.
- Get involved in your neighborhood and community. Introduce your children to people you meet.
- Many schools, youth organizations, and congregations have people on staff-guidance counselors, psychologists, and others-who are specially trained to work with young people. Encourage your children to meet them and talk with them.
- With your child, identify the adults who regularly interact with him or her.
- Get to know your children’s friends. Welcome them into your home.
